



FAQS ABOUT COVID-19 VACCINATION & FERTILITY

Q. Can taking the COVID-19 vaccine lead to infertility? A. The COVID-19 mRNA vaccines are not composed of live virus; therefore, they are not thought to cause an increased risk of infertility, first or second trimester loss, stillbirth, or congenital anomalies.

Q. Can I take the COVID-19 vaccine if I am pregnant? A. Yes. Pregnant women are more susceptible to contracting severe COVID-19. Therefore, it is recommended that all individuals who are pregnant or those who intend to conceive should receive the COVID-19 vaccination.

Q. Can the COVID-19 vaccine affect my fetus or baby once born?

A. Preliminary data suggests that vaccination during pregnancy and the postpartum while breastfeeding can protect the fetus and newborn. The studies showed the presence of SARS-CoV-2 IgG antibodies in umbilical cord blood of mothers who received the COVID-19 vaccine during pregnancy.

Q. If I am pregnant and take the COVID-19 vaccine, can I resume activities as normal?

A. After you are fully vaccinated, you can resume activities that you did prior to the pandemic.
